- Planning is hard!
 - Failure is not the opposite of success, it's part of success!
- Cumulative effects
 - Acknowledging the finite carrying capacity of air, water, and land take a more holistic approach and consider the cumulative effects rather than looking at projects in isolation
- Hierarchy
 - Provincial direction > regional plans > subregional and issue specific plans > management plans > operational plans
- South Saskatchewan Regional Plan
 - Sets long term vision for the region with balanced economic, environmental, and social outcomes and objectives
 - Directd creation of new conservation areas
 - Created Environmental Mgmt Frameworks to manage for air and water quality
 - Directed subregional mgmt plans
